



Eco-Schools Bronze Award Criteria Checklist

The Eco-Schools Committee

- The Eco-Schools Committee made up of a mixed group of pupils and adults.
- The Committee meets at least twice a year.
Notes are kept on each meeting.
- School is kept informed about the Committee's discussions and actions.

Environmental Review

- A formal or informal environmental review of the school is carried out by the members of the committee.
- The results of the review are discussed by the Committee.
- Following the review, activities are planned to improve the school's environmental performance.

Action Plan

- The Committee decides on some action for the school, based on the environmental review.
- The Committee agrees about who will take the responsibility for specific actions.

Monitoring & Evaluation

- The Committee records progress on the action taken.
- The Committee discusses the success or otherwise of the action being undertaken.

Curriculum Work

- Environmental issues are covered as part of curriculum work in most year groups across a range of subjects.

Informing & Involving

- The Committee has a school notice board that gives details about the environmental activities being carried out.
- Parents know about the action being undertaken by the school.
- The wider school community learns about the environmental activity going on in the school.

Eco Code

- There is an agreement on some environmental statements for the school drawn up by the Committee.
